Denmark is a monarchy with 5.4 million inhabitants. More than a million of the population is under 17 years. Similarly, more than a million of the population is over 60. The size of the active population (those in work plus the unemployed) is thus about 3 million people. Most of them live in towns and urbanized districts. Copenhagen is the capital and the biggest city in Denmark. Other big cities are Århus, Odense and Aalborg.

There are almost 2.9 million families, of which over 667,000 have children. Almost 1.5 million adults live on their own, about 132,000 of them have children.

Over the period 1 January 2003 to 1 January 2004 the population increased by about 15,000 people. Immigration (net) to Denmark accounted for 7,000 of this increase. Immigrants and their descendants accounted for 8.2 per cent of the total population.

Danes make up about 1.4 per cent of the total population in the EU.





Population by age 1960 and 2004





Labour market



Denmark is a service society. We do services for others – and we do them for money.

In 2002, 35 per cent were employed in public and personal services: nursing, education and day care provision for children. 73 per cent were employed in the service sector, which in addition to public and personal services also comprise financial services, communications, transport, hotels and restaurants, and all kinds of business services.

As 78 per cent of all people who form part of the active population are in the labour force, the requirements of available public services are great. Both children, young people and the elderly receive education, and day care facilities or activities are provided via public institutions. In 2002 day care facilities were provided for over 500,000 children.

5.2 per cent of the Danish labour force was unemployed in 2002; which is among the lowest unemployment rates in the EU.









Denmark is no longer an agricultural country, although agricultural land still accounts for a large share of Denmark's total area.

The number of agricultural holdings are steadily falling every year, and the number of farms reached 50,500 in 2002. The decline in total arable land is not however as sharp as that of agricultural holdings. The size of farms is thus increasing.

Although employment in agriculture accounts for under 4 per cent of the total number of persons employed in Denmark, the share of Denmark's total export trade accounted for by agriculture was about 20 per cent

Denmark is the largest exporter of pork and about 31 per cent of total earnings in agriculture are accounted for by pork production.





Denmark is a small open economy with a great dependence on foreign trade.

In 2003 Danish exports totalled almost DKK 437 billion, corresponding to 31 per cent of the gross domestic product. During the same year imports totalled DKK 373 billion, corresponding to 26 per cent of the gross domestic product. 66 per cent of Danish exports are to EU countries, while 71 per cent. of imports are from EU countries.


The most important trading partner is Germany, accounting for more than 23 per cent of Danish imports and 19 per cent of Danish exports. Other important trading partners are Sweden and United Kingdom.

Danish exports are concentrated on manufactured products. Imports are mainly used for further processing by Danish enterprises.



Economics



The national accounts describe expenditure and revenue in the Danish national economy. Total revenue generated over one year is tantamount to the value of output and is measured by the gross domestic product (GDP), which amounted to DKK 1,391 bn. in 2003.

This amount was used for private consumption (DKK 661 bn.), government consumption (DKK 371 bn.), private and public capital formation (DKK 270 bn.). Total expenditure was DKK 89 bn. lower than total revenue, corresponding to the surplus on the trade balance.

The reason why Denmark's surplus on the current account was "only" DKK 42 bn. in 2003 is, among other reasons, due to the fact that interest on Denmark's net foreign debt and also expenditure on foreign aid from the export surplus of DKK 89 bn. are deducted from the export surplus of DKK 89 bn.

Since 1990 Denmark has experienced a surplus on the current account – except for 1998 – but Denmark still has a net foreign debt. At the end of 2003 Denmark's net foreign debt reached DKK 210 bn.
