

for individual units, incomplete coverage, non-response and imputations and processing errors.

Although many of these errors are corrected by careful processing procedures, some still remain.

The effect of the remaining errors is generally slight, although they may be important for small

groups in the population.

For additional information on data presented, please consult other sources available in NBS library,

local libraries or write directly to the agency indicated in the source notes.

Efforts will continue to be made to improve the quality of this publication and to make it more

relevant to as many users as possible. In this regard, comments or suggestions that may help NBS

to improve this publication are very much welcome. In the meantime, we hope that the present

publication will be of use to planners, policy makers, researchers, academicians and all those who

need statistical information on Tanzania for evidence-based policy formulation and decision

making at all levels.

The Statistical Abstract is an annual publication produced by the National Bureau of Statistics, which provides the statistical summary on various socio-economic indicators for Tanzania. Some figures in this publication vary from those in the earlier editions due to the updates.

#### A: Land and Climate

#### Land

Tanzania has a total area of 945,454 square kilometers (sq. kms).

Inland Water covers 61,500 sq. kms.

Land area is 883,954 sq. kms.

#### Climate

The rainfall regimes in Tanzania are unimodal and bimodal. Unimodal regime occurs between November/December and April over Southern, Southwestern, Central and Western areas.

The bimodal rainfall regime has two rain seasons, the long rain season (*masika*) experienced between March and May and the short rain season (*vuli*) occurring between October and December over the Northern coast, Northeastern Highlands, Lake Victoria Basin and the Islands of Unguja and Pemba

#### **B:** Constitution and National Assembly

#### Constitution

United Republic of Tanzania is a sovereign state made up of Tanganyika and Zanzibar. The two sovereign republics of Tanganyika and Zanzibar formed a political union on 26<sup>th</sup> April 1964. Interim Constitution was in use since 1965 then was replaced in 1977 with the constitution which is currently in use.

#### **E:** National Accounts

In 2015 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at Current Market Price was TZS 90,863,681million and was estimated to grow at 7.0 percent.

The economic activities shares of 2015 Gross Domestic Product at current prices for Tanzania Mainland were:

- 31.1 percent for Agriculture, Forest and Fishing
- 26.1 percent for Industry and Construction
- 42.9 percent for Services,

#### **Government Revenue and Expenditure**

In 2014/15 the Government collected domestic revenue amounting to TZS 10,597.7 billion. Tax revenue was TZS 9,891.7 billion, and non-tax revenue (grants, property income, sale of goods and services, fines and penalties) was TZS 706.0 billion.

In the same Financial Year, the Government spent a total amount of TZS 14,603.7 billion. Out of this amount, recurrent expenditure was TZS 10,893.5 billion and development expenditure was TZS 3,710.2 billion.

#### F: Agriculture

Production for some of the food crops increased in 2015 compared to the previous year except for wheat, maize, millet and potatoes. As for cash crops there was a decrease in production in 2015 except for sugar, coffee and tea.

#### **G:** Industry

Production in selected Minerals in 2015 shows an increase in almost all minerals except Kaolin, Diamonds, Gemstone, and Bauxite.

#### Industrial Establishments with 10 or more workers

In 2015 there were 147,896 workers employed in industrial establishments with 10 or more workers. Out of that, 20,108 were employed in mining, 114,522 in manufacturing and 13,266 in electricity and water.

The total installed capacity of electricity in 2015 was 1,034.2 (MW), electricity generated was 6,457.4 (GWH), and electricity sold was 4,952.6 GWH.

#### **H**: Construction

Production of cement for 2015 was 3,273,000 tonnes of which 126,391 tonnes were exported. The importation of cement was 1,257,578 tonnes and consumption of cement was 4,404,187 tonnes.

Cement consumption increase by 7.9 percent in 2015 compared to 19.7 percent in 2014

#### I: Trade

The value of foreign trade in 2015 was TZS.40,938,436 million Balance of merchandised trade was TZS. (17,766,564) million

#### J: Transport and Communication

#### **Transport**

Regional roads: Length of paved roads increased from 845 kilometers in 2013to 1,012kilometers in 2014 and length of unpaved roads decreased from 20,644kilometers in 2013 to 19,450 kilometers in 2014. Air passengers (domestic) increased from 1,240,066 in 2014 to 1,619,108passengers in 2015.

#### **Telecommunication**

Service providers: Fixed line operators were two and mobile operators were seven.

The number of subscribers increased from 32,165,154 in 2014 to 35,928,712subscribers in 2015.

#### K: Currency and Banking

A total commercial banks asset at the end of December 2014 wasTZS.23,436,505.5 Million Domestic Assets, TZS. 21,128,873.1million and Foreign Assets TZS. 2,307,632.4 million Exchange rate was 1 US\$ to 1,653TZS.

#### L: Education

In Tanzania Mainland, the number of public and private primary schools in 2014was 16,538 Total enrolment in public and private primary schools was 8,223 thousands.

Eighty two percent of Pupils dropped by reason (truancy) in government and non-government primary schools. In Tanzania Zanzibar, Total enrolment in public and private primary schools was 261,212

#### M: Health

In 2015, total number of hospitals was 7,249 of which 5,358 were government owned hospitals and 1,891were private owned.

In 2015, there were 37,418,690 total patients; of which 35,559,734 were out-patients and 1,858,956 were in-patients. In Zanzibar the total patients were 438,973 of which out-patients were 374,982 and in-patients were 63,991.

#### N: Hotels and National Parks

The country recorded a total of 987,850 tourists in 2014 of which 540,747 were visitors from outside the country and 447,103 were Tanzanians.

The most popularly visited national park in 2014 was Tarangire (with tourists 399,880), followed by Lake Manyara (179,466) and Udzungwa (172,617).

#### O: Retail prices

Inflation rates for Tanzania Mainland were 5.6 percent in 2015 compared to an inflation rate of 6.1 percent recorded in 2014. In Tanzania Zanzibar the inflation was 5.7 percent in 2015 compared to 5.6 percent recorded in 2014;

Tanzania Mainland: Indices for food were 177.21 and non-food137.60 in 2015.

#### P: Crime

In 2015 there were 519,203 criminal cases and 1,390,482 traffic cases.

Tanzania Mainland; 517,598 criminal cases and 1,374,518 traffic cases

Tanzania Zanzibar: 1,605 criminal cases and 15,964 traffic cases.

#### Q: Investments

Total service rendered by the Tanzania Investment Center in 2012 was 10,377 compared to 11,098 in 2011.

Value of Foreign Direct Investment in 2012 was US\$ 1,806 million and US\$ 1,320in 2011 Value of Foreign Direct Investment Capital was US\$ 1872.4 in 2013 and US\$ 1,799.6 in 2012

#### **R:** Environment Statistics

The distributions of Forest by type of forest indicate that 93.0 percent is woodland.

Looking at forest use, it can be observed that 60.3 percent used for production and about 39.7 percent is protected

In 2015, the number of fishers in both marine and fresh water was 183,800, fishing crafts 57,291 and production was 362,645 tons.

About 57,365 km<sup>2</sup> is area under National Parks



# A. Land and Climate

#### **Tanzania Mainland**

Tanzania Mainland has a total area of 942,800 sq. kms of which 881,300 sq. kms are land area and 61,500 sq. kms are inland water. A distinctive feature of Tanzania Mainland is the rift valley whose form is marked in many places by long, narrow and deep depressions often filled with lakes. The Great Rift Valley runs from near Zambezi River in Zimbabwe Northward through Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia and across the Red Sea to Israel. Lake Tanganyika lies in the western rift which continues northwards through Lake Kivu.

Many rivers flow into the Indian Ocean or the great lakes. However some of them cease flowing during the dry season, and only the Rufiji, entering the Indian Ocean opposite Mafia Island and the Kagera, flowing into Lake Victoria, are navigable by anything larger than a canoe.

Lake Tanganyika drains into the Congo River system then into the Atlantic Ocean. Lake Nyasa waters reach the Zambezi River, then the Indian Ocean. Lake Victoria which differs from other major lakes of Tanzania in that it has been formed by a gentle down-warping of the earth's crust in a shallow subsidence, drains into the Nile, then into the Mediterranean Sea.

Woodland, bush land and wooden grasslands, are the predominant types of vegetation in Tanzania Mainland. The main climatic feature is the long dry spell from May to October, followed by a period of low rainfall, which is often concentrated into relatively few days of heavy showers.

The main rainy season on the coast is from March to May but there is a second season from October to December. Total rainfall increases towards the north. Around Lake Victoria, the rainfall is well distributed throughout the year but the peak rainfall season is from March to May.

#### Tanzania Zanzibar

Tanzania Zanzibar is made up of Unguja and Pemba islands. It lies off the eastern coast and is situated in the Indian Ocean, some 30 kilometers from the mainland of East Africa. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, of about 2,654 square kilometers of which Unguja island covers 1,666 square kilometers and Pemba Island covers the remaining 988 square kilometers. Coconuts, cloves, chillies, copra and seaweed are grown for export; fishing is also important to the local economy. The island's leading port and largest town is Zanzibar; located on the western coast, it has a fine harbour with docking facilities for both passenger and cargo vessels.

#### Analysis of Rainfall and Temperature for Tanzania in 2015

#### **Rainfall**

Tanzania is characterized by two rainfall regimes: namely unimodal and bimodal rainfall regimes. The seasonal rains for the unimodal regime occur between November/December and April over the Southern, Southwestern, Central and Western areas of the country. The bimodal rainfall regime has two rain seasons, the long rain season (*masika*) experienced between March and May and the short rain season (*vuli*) occurring between October and December over the Northern coast, Northeastern Highlands, Lake Victoria Basin and the Islands of Unguja and Pemba.

In 2015 some areas around Lake Victoria Basin, Coast, Southwestern Highlands, and some parts of Northeastern Highlands received more rainfall especially during the long rain season as it can be seen in meteorological stations like Bukoba, Mwanza, Dar es Salaam, Mtwara and Tanga (see Rainfall Table A4). Other parts of the country received near normal to below normal rainfall.

#### **Temperature**

Temperature conditions were expressed as mean maximum and minimum air temperatures. Observed annual average lowest minimum temperature during 2015was 10.5°Cin Mbeya and other station which were below 16°C include Songea, Iringa and Arusha. The highest annual average maximum air temperature of 32.0°C was observed at Dar es Salaam station followed by Kibaha (31.7°C),Zanzibar (31.5°C) and Tanga station (31.0°C) (Tables A.9 and A.10).



# **B** Constitution

The United Republic of Tanzania is a sovereign state, consisting of the country formerly known as Tanganyika and the islands of Unguja and Pemba formerly known as the Peoples' Republic of Zanzibar. Tanganyika became a sovereign state under a Governor General on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 1961. The country became a democratic republic under an Executive President on her first anniversary of independence i.e. 9<sup>th</sup> December, 1962. The islands of Unguja and Pemba became independent on 10<sup>th</sup>December 1963 under a Sultanate, but the Sultan's regime was overthrown on 12<sup>th</sup> January, 1964 and was replaced by the Peoples' Republic of Zanzibar under a Revolutionary Council headed by an Executive President.

The two sovereign republics of Tanganyika and Zanzibar formed a political union on 26<sup>th</sup>April, 1964 and became the present United Republic of Tanzania.

The current Constitution of the United Republic of Tanzania came into being in 1977 by replacing the Interim Constitution, which had been in use since July 1965. Under the Constitution, which has been amended several times, the following subjects are union matters<sup>1</sup>:

Matters concerning Zanzibar only, are dealt with by the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar, whereas in respect of Tanzania Mainland they are dealt with by the Union Government. The seat of the Union Government is currently in Dar es Salaam.

The Executive consists of the President elected by universal suffrage; assisted by a Vice – President, Prime Minister and a Cabinet of Ministers. The Vice-President is elected together with the President as a running mate on one ballot. When the President is elected the Vice-President is also automatically elected.

The Prime Minister is appointed by the President from among Members of Parliament from constituencies, but does not assume office until the appointment is confirmed by a resolution of the majority of the members of Parliament.

The term of office of the President is five years, but can be re-elected for another term of five years only. The President must therefore retire after serving for two consecutive terms of five years. The United Republic of Tanzania has a unicameral legislature called the "National Assembly" which at the end of December, 2015 had 386 members. General Elections are held after every five years.



## C. Population

In August 2012, the United Republic of Tanzania conducted a population and housing census with reference date being the night of August 25/26; 2012. That census was the seventh population and housing census to be carried out in the country and the fifth during the post-independence period. The other censuses were carried out in 1948, 1957, 1967, 1978, 1988 and 2002.

The 2012 Population and Housing Census was carried out using the *de-facto* system of enumeration whereby all persons who spent the census night (reference date) in the country were enumerated irrespective of whether they were normal residents or not. Once enumerated they were allocated to the place of enumeration.

Two types of interview questionnaires were used in the 2012 Census. The short questionnaire was used for collecting information of limited scope for the entire population of the country. The long questionnaire, which was administered to a sample of the total population, sought more detailed information concerning each individual and household. Both questionnaires used structured and pre-coded questions. Data capture was carried out using the OMR technology.



### D. Labour Statistics

#### **Labour Statistics**

The National Bureau of Statistics collects data on Employment through three major surveys: the Labour Force Survey, Informal Sector Survey and the Annual Survey of Employment and Earnings. Labour Force Survey and Informal Sector Surveys are household based surveys whereas the Employment and Earnings Survey is an establishment based survey. Household based surveys are supposed to be conducted after every five years. The latest available data on labour force are



from the 2014 Integrated Labour Force Survey, which covered both urban and rural areas.

#### **Integrated Labour Force Survey**

Integrated Labour Force Survey collects information through four major modules; labour force general, informal sector, child labour and time use.

#### **Main Concepts and Definitions of LabourStatistics**

**Economically Active Population**: Persons who supply labour for the production of goods and services for the market, barter or home consumption. Includes paid employees, self –employed persons and unpaid family workers, but excludes persons engaged in domestic activities, such as taking care of children and cooking food for own family.

Currently Economically Active: Persons who were either employed or unemployed in the reference week.

- Employed Persons: Persons who did one hour or more of work in the reference period either for payment in cash or in kind or who were self-employed for profit or family gain, plus persons temporarily absent from these activities but were definitely going to return to them (e.g. on leave or sick).
- Underemployed Persons: A person is classified as underemployed if she/he is working less than forty (40) hours in the reference week and states that she/he was available for more work in that reference week.
- Unemployed Persons: Persons who were not employed as defined above but who stated
  that they were available for work.

Currently not Economically Active: Persons who were neither employed nor unemployed in the reference period. These include persons doing solely unpaid domestic work in their own houses, studying or persons not working because they were sick or retired.

**Participation Rate**: Number of persons economically active in a given group divided by total persons in that group and expressed usually as a percentage.

NB: The figures in the following tables are based on Standard Definition of Employment



# E. National Accounts, Public Finance and Parastatal Accounts

#### 1.0 Historical Background

The revision of National Accounts of Tanzania Mainland aimed at enhancing the quality of National Accounts estimates and better portray the economic activities in the country and ensure international comparability in accordance with the United Nations System of National Accounts 1993 (SNA 1993) and 2008.

The history of National Accounts compilation in Tanzania Mainland dates back to the year 1954. Since then, improvements have been made in the methodologies used. The previous series of National Accounts main aggregates were based on the concepts and classification prescribed in the United Nations System of National Accounts of 1953, 1968 and 1993 and 2008.

The first revision of National Accounts in Tanzania referred to the year 1966 and was based on the 1953 SNA. The second revision was done for the year 1976 based on the 1968 SNA. The third revision was for the year 1992 with estimates based on the 1968 and partly on 1993 SNAs. The fourth revision was for year 2001 with estimates based on 1993 SNA. The current revision of National Accounts is for the year 2007 and is based on the 1993 and 2008 SNAs.

#### 1.2 The Need for Change of the Benchmark and Revision of National Accounts

The benchmark estimates are for the reference year to which constant prices refer. For example, for GDP at constant 2007 prices, the benchmark year is 2007. The reasons for the choice of a year as a benchmark include the availability of relevant data collected from different surveys in the country that were not yet incorporated in the national accounts system. The revision of National Accounts involves extrapolation of the benchmark year estimates to the years preceding or succeeding the benchmark year.

The 2007 change of benchmark and revision of National Accounts estimates for Tanzania Mainland were mainly done because the 2001 benchmark was out of date and did not reflect the structural changes that had occurred in the economy. Therefore, the revision was done in order to:

• Integrate changes that have taken place especially in the patterns of production, consumption and investment in the economy

- Account for the relative price changes over time. As the base year becomes remote, such changes make the prices irrelevant
- Integrate products in the economy; as continuous developments and innovations lead to new products to appear in the market while obsolescence causes old products to disappear from the market;
- Incorporate all the new data available in different sectors, new surveys such as household surveys; and
- Accommodate in the compilation of National Accounts Statistics in Tanzania revised requirements in accordance with the 1993 and 2008 SNAs. The methodological guideline changes need to be accommodated accordingly.

#### 1.3 Definitions

Gross Domestic Product at Market Prices is the producers' value of the gross outputs of resident producers, less the purchasers' value of their intermediate consumption. In simpler words it is the market value of all final goods and services produced by the resident producers of Tanzania before deduction of allowances for wear and tear or depreciation of capital equipment. It is equal to the sum of consumption expenditure, gross domestic capital formation and net exports of goods and services of Tanzania.

*Gross Domestic Product at Factor Cost* is the gross domestic product at market prices less excess of indirect taxes over subsidies.

**National Income at Market Prices** is the sum of compensation of resident employees, the excess of the property and entrepreneurial income receivable by resident economic agents over the property and entrepreneurial income payable by them and indirect taxes net of subsidies.

Gross Fixed Capital Formation are the outlays (purchases and own account construction) on additions of new durable goods (commodities) to their stock of fixed assets less their net sales of similar second-hand and scrapped goods. Excluded are outlays of households on durable goods and government's outlays on goods for military use. It includes the acquisition of breeding stock, drought animals and dairy cattle.

**Parastatal Enterprises** are commercial enterprises owned by government or with majority government participation and whose accounts are not directly integrated into government budgets.



## 2.0 Government Revenue and Expenditure

#### 2.1 Revenue

During 2015/16the Government continued to implement the priorities which include: Development Plan 2015/16, among the initiative of the development plan to put more emphasize in village power and water supply, to accomplish ongoing projects and develop human capital. The objective is to achieve the National Development Vision 2025. In 2014/15 the Government collected domestic revenue amounting to TZS 10,597.7 billion. Tax revenue was TZS 9,891.7billion, while Non-tax revenue (grants, property income, sale of goods and services, fines and penalties) was TZS 706.0 billion. Over the years, the trend in domestic revenue has been increasing due to continued efforts to improve efficiency in tax administration, particularly in the collection of Value Added Tax (VAT) on both imported and domestic goods, and income tax (Table E.26).

## 2.2 Expenditure

In 2015/16, the Government spent a total amount of TZS 19,412.6 billion. Out of this amount, recurrent expenditure was TZS 13,503.6 billion and development expenditure was TZS 5,909.1 billion (Table E.26).





Figure E. 2: Trends in Government Finance, Tanzania Mainland, 2008/09 – 2014/15

# F. Agriculture

### **General Information**

Agriculture is the largest sector of the economy in Tanzania. According to the 2012 Population and Housing Census the majority of the population (about 70 percent) live in rural areas where their livelihood depends on agriculture either directly or indirectly. It contributes about 25 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and accounts for half of employed labour force. Agriculture is the largest source of foreign exchange earnings and it feeds both the rural and urban populations.



#### **Definitions**

*Holding* is an economic unit of agricultural production under single management. It consists of all livestock kept and all land used for agricultural production, without regard to title.

*Field* is a continuous piece of land cultivated as one by a holder, even if planted with different crops. An individual holding may consist of one or more such fields.

**Plot** is a portion of the field planted with one specific crop e.g. maize or sorghum, or a crop mixture e.g. maize-beans.

*Large Scale Farms* are farms with at least 20 hectares of cultivated land or 50 heads of cattle or 100 goats/pigs/sheep or 1,000 chickens. In addition to this, they should fulfil all of the four listed conditions:

- Greater part of the produce should go to the market
- Operation of farm should be continuous
- There should be an application of machinery/implements on the farm
- Should have at least one permanent employee

**Bull** is a male cattle, with its sexual organs intact and capable of reproduction

*Cow* is a female cattle, 2 years of age or above and is mainly for milk production *Steer* is a male cattle that is castrated before sexual maturity, especially one raised for beef

*Heifer* is a young cow over one year old that has not produced a calf (including calf)

Male calf is young male cattle less than one year of age

Female calf is young female cattle less than one year of age




Figure F. 1: Number of Large Scale Farms; Tanzania Mainland, 1987/88, 1994/95, 2002/03 and 2007/08

# G. Industry

### **General Information**

The National Bureau of Statistics collects data on industrial sector through three major surveys: the industrial census, the annual survey of industrial production and the quarterly survey of industrial production. The annual survey has been conducted since 1965. The industrial census is the extension of the annual survey in terms of content and coverage. The last industrial census is that of 2013. The conduct of the quarterly survey started in 1986,



before that a monthly survey was being carried out. The data collected through censuses and annual surveys relate to establishment description; employment and remuneration; production costs; output and expenditure on fixed assets.

The annual survey covers all establishments engaging 10 or more persons, while during the census an attempt is made to cover all known establishments engaging one or more persons. The quarterly survey is limited to establishments engaging 50 or more persons and only those in manufacturing sector. The data collected through this survey relate to the production of commodities and prices and are used to compile the Production Index of Manufacturing Industries (PIMI) and Producer Price Index (PPI).

## **Concepts and Definitions**

*Industrial Sector* is a sector which includes all establishments engaged in activities that fall under mining, and quarrying, manufacturing, production and distribution of electricity, gas and water.

Statistical Unit is a business entity for which the required data sets are collected and compiled.

**Establishment** is an economic unit, which engages under a single control, in one or predominantly one kind of industrial activity at a single location i.e. an individual firm, mine, factory or a workshop. It should be noted that, due to record keeping practices of some firms, it has not been possible in every case to strictly follow the definition of an establishment as stated above. In a few cases, the restrictions especially on location have been relaxed to some extent.

**Reference period** is the time to which the statistical data or statistics relate or refer to. In the context of industrial statistics the usual reference period is the calendar year.

*Employees* are the persons who during the reference period; performed some work for pay in cash or in-kind. They include persons employed under permanent, temporary or casual terms. Proprietors, unpaid workers, and others who are not in receipt of regular payment are excluded.

**Persons engaged:** The term covers employees as well as working proprietors, unpaid family workers and other unpaid workers. Directors and ex-employees receiving pension are excluded

*Labour costs:* The term refers to total sum of wages, salaries, benefits in kind and contributions to social security schemes by the establishment.

*Gross output:* It includes value of products and by-products made by the establishment during the reference period regardless of whether they have been sold or are still part of stock; the value of services or work done by the establishment for others; the sales value of goods sold in the same condition as purchased; and the net value of work in progress. The products are valued at exfactory sales price less indirect taxes.

**Production costs:** These are costs of materials (raw materials, chemicals, auxiliary materials and packing materials); costs of work done by others for the establishment, purchase value of goods sold in the same condition as purchased; and other costs including repair and maintenance.

*Value added:* This is the difference between gross output and production costs.

*Electricity:* The term refers to installed capacity; production and sales of electricity. Information on electricity generated by industrial and other enterprises as well as individual households, for their own use, is not available. The sales of electricity shown are not confined to the townships only, but also represent supplies to industrial and commercial concerns in other parts of the respective regions.

*Mining:* Is the process or activity of extracting ores or minerals from the ground.

*Natural Gas:* Is a fossil fuel formed when layers of buried plants and animals are exposed to intense heat and pressure over thousands of years





## I Trade

#### **General Information**

The International Merchandise statistics record goods entering and leaving the economic territory of the country. The statistical territory may coincide with the economic territory of a country or part of it. When the statistical and economic territories of a country differ, International Merchandise Trade Statistics do not provide a complete record of inflow and outflow of goods.



#### **Definitions of the Terms Used**

**Direct Imports:** Goods that enter at the time of importation for consumption or for warehousing in a country.

**Re-exports:** All imported goods, which are subsequently, exported either without subsequent change under drawback includes ship and aircraft's stores.

**Domestic Exports**: Goods grown, produced or manufactured in a country, which are exported to foreign countries, or sold on ships or on aircraft stores. Materials, which are imported into, and processed or manufactured in a country and then subsequently exported, are classified.

*Exports*: Domestic exports and re-exports

#### Valuation:

- **Imports** are valued at Cost, Insurance and Freight, (C.I.F.) port or place of importation.
- Exports are valued Free on Board (F.O.B.) port or place of exit from a country except in the case of gold, silver and diamonds where the value in gross amount is realized on the sale.
- Re-Exports are valued F.O.B. port of place of exit from a country that is, the landed cost of goods at the time of importation plus all other charges up to the time of delivering the goods on board the exporting ship or craft or to the place of exit from a country.

## Country of Origin or Destination:

- **Imports**: the last country of consignment.
- Exports: the first country of consignment except where goods are consigned via another country.

## Good Excluded from Imports and Exports:

#### Imports:

- Travellers samples except in the case of goods subject to duty which are not reexported
- Motor vehicles imported on a *triptyque* or a "carnet de passage en donane" unless such vehicles are not subsequently re-exported
- Naval and military stores
- Diplomatic goods imported by diplomats or cleared ex-bond for their use
- Goods in transit

## Exports:

- Travellers samples
- Passengers baggage
- Motor vehicles exported on a triptyque or a "carnet de passage en donane"
- Naval and military store

## J. Transport and Communications

#### **General**

The information presented under this section covers air transport, railways and road transport, shipping as well as posts and telecommunication services.



Very limited information is available on road transport. Unlike other modes of transport, which are dominated by a few big firms, road transport is dominated by a large number of small operators who have no proper records on their operations. It is therefore difficult to collect reliable information from these units through postal inquiries.



#### **Definitions of Terms Used**

#### **Aviation Statistics:**

*Movements:* These are the numbers of touch-downs and take-offs by aircraft.

Scheduled commercial flights: These are flights performed for remuneration according to published timetables and which are available to the general public at fixed rates. Traffic carried on scheduled flights is classified as scheduled traffic though some of the passengers may be travelling at special affinity group rates. It should be noted that this classification is used in relation to the nature of the flight and not of an airline, which may operate both scheduled and non-scheduled flights.

**Non-scheduled commercial flights:** These are landings and take-offs by aircraft operating for hire or for reward but not according to published timetables.

**Non-commercial flights:** These are landings and take-offs by aircraft operating solely for the benefit of the owner or for the purpose of positioning. Also included in this category are flights made by the government and military aircrafts as well as unscheduled return flights by aircrafts to their points of departure for reasons of safety.

Transport and Communication

Passengers embarked and disembarked are those passengers commencing or completing their

journeys but excluding direct transit passengers.

Transit passengers are passengers continuing their journey in the same aircraft or in a different

aircraft without checking out. Transit passengers are counted only once.

Freight and mail: These refer to freight and mail loaded or off-loaded by all aircraft which served the

airport, excluding aircraft fuel, stores and cargo remaining in the aircraft. Commercial freight

excludes diplomatic freight and mail, post office and excess baggage.

**Shipping Statistics:** 

Gross Registered Tonnage: This refers to space measurement, one cubic meter being regarded as

equal to one tonne. It is the capacity of the entire space within the frames and ceiling of the hull

together with those closed in spaces above deck available for cargo, stores, passengers and crew.

Net Registered Tonnage (NRT): This is what remains after deducting from the gross registered

tonnage the spaces occupied by propelling machinery, fuel and other stores, crew quarters, master

cabin and navigation spaces. It represents the space available for cargo and passengers. Both gross

and net registered tonnages are measurements of cubic capacity and not of weight.

Dead Weight Tonnage (DWT): This is the weight (tonnes) of cargo that a ship can carry or carries.

The weight of cargo includes packing.

Other Definitions:

**Passenger Load Factor** = Passenger-km performed x 100

Passenger-km available

Weight Load Factor =  $\underline{\text{Tonne-km performed}} \times 100$



# K. Currency and Banking

### **Currency**

The currency circulating throughout the United Republic of Tanzania was first issued by the Bank of Tanzania on 14<sup>th</sup> of June, 1966. It replaced the Common East African Currency, which was being issued by the East African Currency Board for circulation in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania. The unit of account of the Tanzania currency is the Tanzanian shilling (TZS). It is used in denomination of TZS 10,000; 5,000; 2,000; 1,000 and 500 for bank notes and TZS500; 200; 100; 50; 20; 10 and 5 for coins.



### **Banking**

As the Central Bank of the country, the Bank of Tanzania which was established in 1966 issues the currency in circulation, regulates banking and credit, and manages Tanzania's foreign exchange reserves. It is also the government's banker and fiscal agent and it manages the public debt.



# L. Education

#### **General Information**

Education services in Tanzania are provided through different levels. These are pre-primary level, primary level, secondary level and tertiary levels. Pre-primary education is for children of age between five and six years. It lasts for two years with no examinations for promotion purpose. The primary education is a seven years education cycle after pre-primary. It is universal



and compulsory to all children from the age of seven years. The formal secondary school education consists of two sequential cycles. The first cycle is a four year ordinary level (Form I to Form IV). The second cycle is a two year program of advanced level (Form V to Form VI). It should also be noted that there are also vocational training programs after completion of form four and form six education where a certificate or diploma can be obtained in various fields. Education data are collected by the Ministry of Education, Science, Technology and Vocational Training through an annual census of educational institutions.



## M. Health

#### **General Information**

In Tanzania, health services are provided by a number of complementary institutions. These institutions are dispensaries, health centers, district/regional hospitals and referral consultant hospitals.

The dispensaries are staffed by clinical officers and clinical assistant with one or two helpers and in some cases a nurse and/or midwife is also



provided. The clinical assistant receives a 3 - year training course in anatomy, physiology and hygiene with good training in diagnostic methods and treatment of common diseases.

Supporting the dispensaries are health centers. These give priority to preventive measures and hygiene but in practice they are extensively used for the treatment of common diseases. Most health centers have a room for minor surgery and have 20-30 beds for in-patients including maternity cases. A health centre is run by a clinical officer, with a secondary school education and more elaborate education in diagnosis and treatment as well as training in minor surgery. He/She is of higher grade than clinical assistant. The clinical officer is usually assisted by one or two clinical assistants, a nurse/midwife with one or two maternal and child health aids,a health aid and a health assistant.

Above the health centre, there is the district hospital. It is the base for staffing and supplying medical provision to all dispensaries, health centres and a hospital (mostly private or faith based) where difficult or serious cases are referred to. Generally there is one district hospital per administrative district but in certain cases a district may have more than one district hospital. District hospitals are



provided with medical doctors (one or more according to size), stores for drugs and equipment, a diagnostic laboratory, x-ray, operation facilities and beds for referred patients.

District and regional hospitals are in most cases similar except that regional hospitals are larger, have more facilities and are staffed by between 5-10 doctors including one or two specialists. At the national level, there are four referral hospitals which serve Tanzania Mainland and one in Zanzibar.



## N. Hotels and National Parks

#### **General Information**

Hotel Occupancy Statistics: The monthly survey of hotels is conducted on sample basis by the National Bureau of Statistics with the objective of obtaining background information for development planning in the hotel industry. The information is collected under the Statistics Act, 2002.



**National Parks:** At present there are thirteen national parks in Tanzania. These, together with the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, cover an area of approximately 47,256 square kilometers and occupy about 5 percent of the total land area of Tanzania. In order to assess the volume of visits to the national parks, information is collected on a monthly basis



from each national park. The information includes the number of visits by residence of visitors and the revenue collected. Below is a list of the thirteen national parks by size and the year of establishment.



## O. Retail Prices

#### **National Consumer Price Index (NCPI)**

#### **Definition**

The NCPI measures the change over time in the cost of a fixed basket of goods and services that are purchased by a representative sample of households in Tanzania. A basket includes a list of 224 goods and services that are being priced on monthly basis.

#### Weights and a reference period

The NCPI weights are based on monetary expenditures relating to consumption for all private households in the 21 geographic regions of Tanzania Mainland. The index weights are based on expenditures of both urban and rural households derived from 2007 Household Budget Survey and the price reference period is September 2010.

#### Classification

The NCPI follows the internationally recommended Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP). NCPI is being disseminated with indices for the 12 major groups of COICOP as well as several additional index aggregations. These additional indices are; 1) Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages - combining food consumed at home and food consumed in restaurants; 2) Energy and Fuels - combining electricity and other fuels for use at home including petrol and diesel; 3) All Items Less Food; and 4) All Items Less Food and Energy.

#### Methodology

The NCPI has incorporated a number of methodological improvements including the use of geometric means for compiling elementary index aggregates, the use of an improved index compilation system, and improved procedures for collecting and processing prices. The modified Laspeyres index formula continues to be used for computing higher level aggregates for the NCPI.



## Q. Investment

#### **Investment**

The Tanzania Investment Centre (TIC) was established in 1997 by the Tanzania Investment Act to be the primary agency of the Government to coordinate, encourage, promote and facilitate investment in Tanzania and to advise the Government on investment policy and related matters.

The agency deals with all enterprises whose minimum capital investment is USD 300,000 or more for foreign owned enterprises and USD 100,000 or more for national enterprises. Enterprises engaged in mining and petroleum follow the approval process contained in their respective laws. However, the agency assists all investors to obtain permits, authorization etc. required by other laws to set up and operate investments in Tanzania.



## **R.** Environment Statistics

Environment is a cross cutting issue that involves all sectors under the mainstream ministries. The demand for environment statistics is increasing in step with the continued environmental challenges faced by modern society. The recognition that human wellbeing depends on the environment has led to an increasing emphasis on environmental and sustainability concerns on which decisions and actions need to be taken. Paramount to these actions is the regular production of environment statistics of the highest possible quality to support evidence-based policy-making.

In various sectors, the environment is impacted upon through deliberate human activities done in the pursuit of livelihood, while some impacts occur naturally. The impacts can be either positive or negative.

Environmental statistics describe the state and trend of the environment, and its most relevant changes through space and time. Environment statistics are integrative in nature, measuring human activities and natural events that affect the environment as well as the impacts of these activities and events, also social responses to environmental impacts and the quality and availability of natural assets. Environment statistics are necessary for producing environmental assessments, state of the environment reports, environment publication/compendia, environmental indicators, indicators of sustainable development as well as to support environmental economic accounting.




